Over the last few years the application of experimental methods to the most diverse philosophical branches has been remarkably successful, to the extent that experimental philosophy has become a discipline both fertile and stable in a short time. This has given rise to a lively debate about the use of empirical data in philosophy, the validity of intuition as evidence, the nature of the philosophical method, or the relevance of running experiments in almost any philosophical area (ethics, epistemology, metaphysics, philosophy of mind, philosophy of language, etc.).

In the wake of these debates is taking place an exponential growth of publications, meetings and associations of this new discipline. Therefore, the Spanish Experimental Philosophy Association (AEFEX, <u>https://</u> www.facebook.com/think.AEFEX/), founded in January 2016 to contribute to the development of this trend, aims to gather in its First Meeting philosophers who run experiments or are interested in applying other empirical methods to traditional philosophical issues.
